NATHANIEL BAILEY

- pioneer lexicographer
- Universal Etymological English Dictionary
- popular, large, comprehensive, sold well

SAMUEL JOHNSON (1709 – 1784)

- added his own ideas, sophisticated definitions
- not to form but register the language

NOAH WEBSTER (1758 – 1843)

- An American Dictionary of the English Language

hoped to standardize American speech (Americans in different parts of the country spelled, pronounced and used English words differently

- spelling reformer (introduced American English spellings, e.g. color, center)
- after his death: Meriam-Webster, 1990s Random House publishing house

- JAMES MURRAY (1837 -1915) editor and father of The new English Dictionary, Oxford English Dictionary (12 volumes) – records the history of the language from historical times
- JOSEF EMANUEL MOUREK (1846 1911) Czech pioneer in English dictionary making contributed to Ottův slovník naučný the first English-Czech Dictionary (1896)

1 General dictionaries: (publishing houses) (OUP, CUP, The Random House, Merriam-Webster's, Longman, Collins)

2 Specialized dictionaries – language: (synonyms, idioms and phrasal verbs, collocations, neologism, pronunciation, etymology, frequency, slang, dialects, catch phrases)

3 Specialized dictionaries – learner's dictionaries: OALD, OLDAE, LDCE, CCD, CALD (level C1-C2), word builders, w. finders

4 Thesauruses:

Oxford Paperback Thesaurus, Roget's International Thesaurus, Longman Lexicon of Contemporary English)

Others: dictionaries for research (database), professional dictionary (business)
