The Academic Environment

University study differs significantly from secondary school.

- Degree programmes with required, required optional, and optional courses.

- Credit system measures performance.

- Greater independence and responsibility expected.

University Study

Degree programmes consist of:

- Required courses (mandatory) A
 - Required optional courses (choose from a list) B
 - Optional courses (free choice) C
- Students must collect the required number of credits.





Expectations

- Independence and self-direction are essential.

- Courses: lectures (presentation) and seminars (discussion, group work).

- Teachers act as facilitators, not sole information sources.

- Fewer contact hours, more homework and reading.

- Library is a crucial resource.



Contact and Communication

- Less personal contact with teachers; office hours are available.
- Use of Learning Management Systems (e.g., IS).
- E-learning vs. blended learning: flexibility vs. limited feedback.
- Communication via university e-mail is mandatory.
- Professional and polite e-mail etiquette required.
- Teachers rarely use social media for communication.



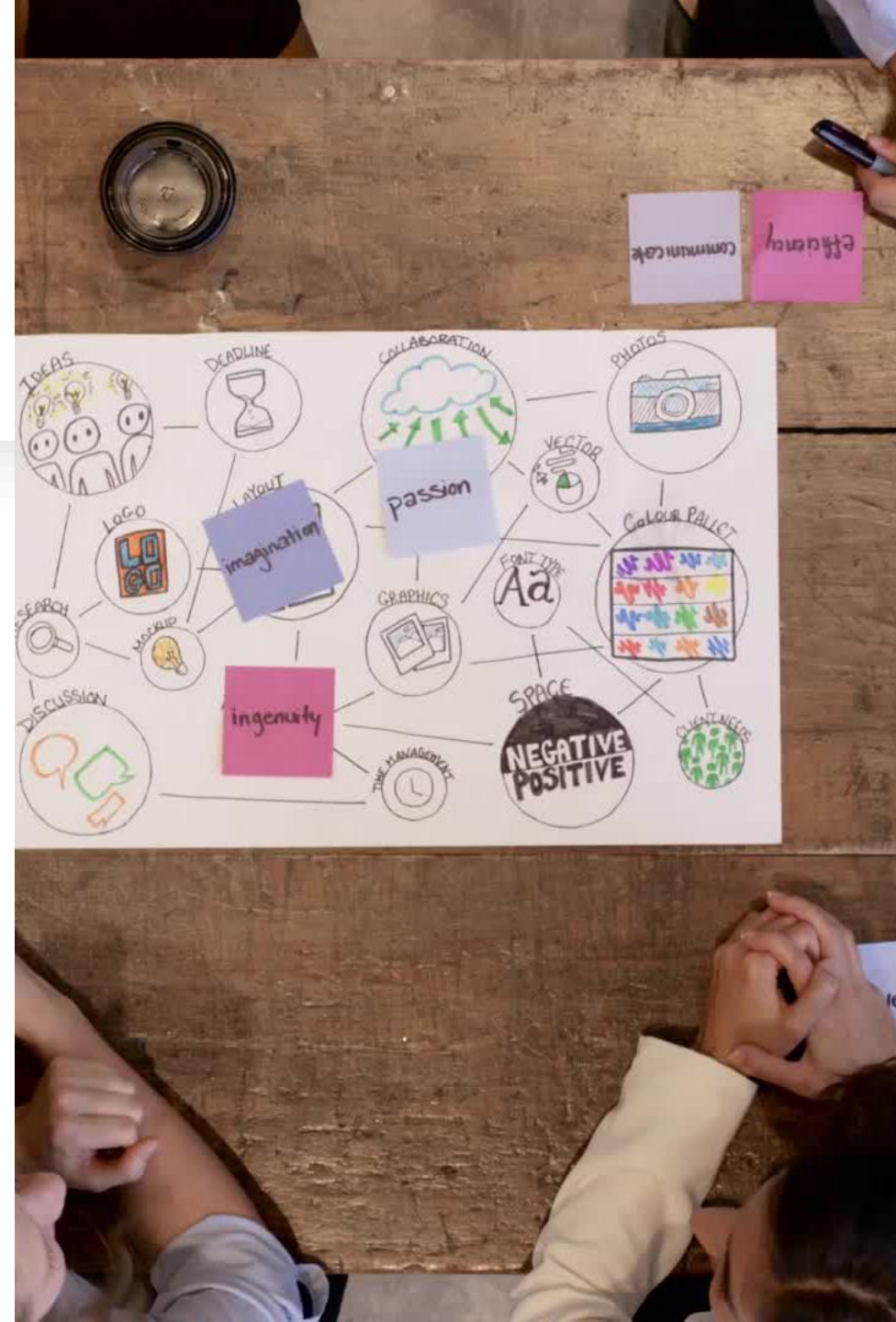
